BY POPULAR DEMAND:

*(At the Salmon Barbecue, one of the several fine dishes that tickled the palate came from the kitchen of Alice Dauer. By popular demand, we present the following Recipe):*

ALICE'S ZUCHINI CASSEROLE

Combine 1 cube melted margarine and 1 small package Pepperidge Farm Stuffing Mix. Steam 2 cups sliced zucchini for 5 minutes.

Combine 1 cup sour cream, 1 can cream of chicken soup, 1 cup grated carrot and 1/2 cut chopped onion. Turn this into the drained zucchini.

Butter an 8 x 12 pan, put in half of stuffing mix, cover with zucchini mix and top with the rest of stuffing mix. Grated cheese may be added to topping.

Bake at 350° for 30 minutes.
