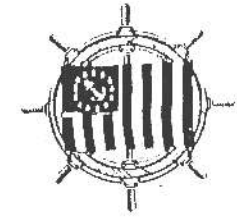
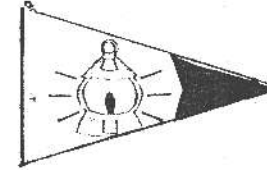

MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE MEETING

Meeting was called to order by Cdr Wutzl at 1310. Cdr Wutzl reported on the Spring Conference in Alderbrook: (1) There will be no dues increase from National this year; (2) National requested that materials of interest be forwarded to them by the Historian; (3) A credit card is available to members that benefits National on a refund basis; and (4) The "Boat Smart" course is an opportunity for recruiting new members.

P/C Lew Garlick, AP suggested a Planning Committee be formed to evaluate the course and other boating courses. Ann Einboden, AP, was appointed Chairman of the Planning Committee by Cdr Wutzl and asked to report on the committee's findings in July.

P/C Myrle Garlick, P, reported there will be no Advanced Piloting (AP) class until the end of 1999.

Ann Einboden, AP, reported there are 12 people in the boating class that ends 14 April. A motion was made, seconded and passed that the 12 members be approved for membership in the Friday Harbor Power Squadron after successfully passing the final exam.

Lt/C William Pierson, S, presented the Treasurer's report for March 1998. His report is published elsewhere in *Harbor Lights*.

Cdr Wutzl reported that he now has the application form for the Chapman Award and asked for any nominations. Discussion tabled until next meeting.

Meeting was adjourned at 1420.

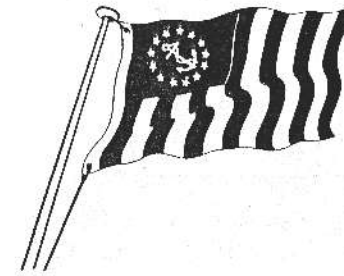
