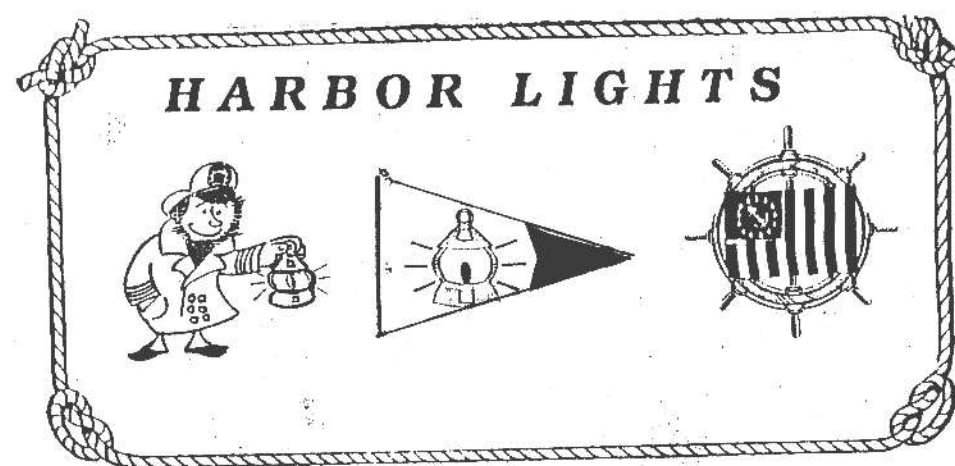

Motion made and approved to accept potential new members on list from Boat Smart Course.

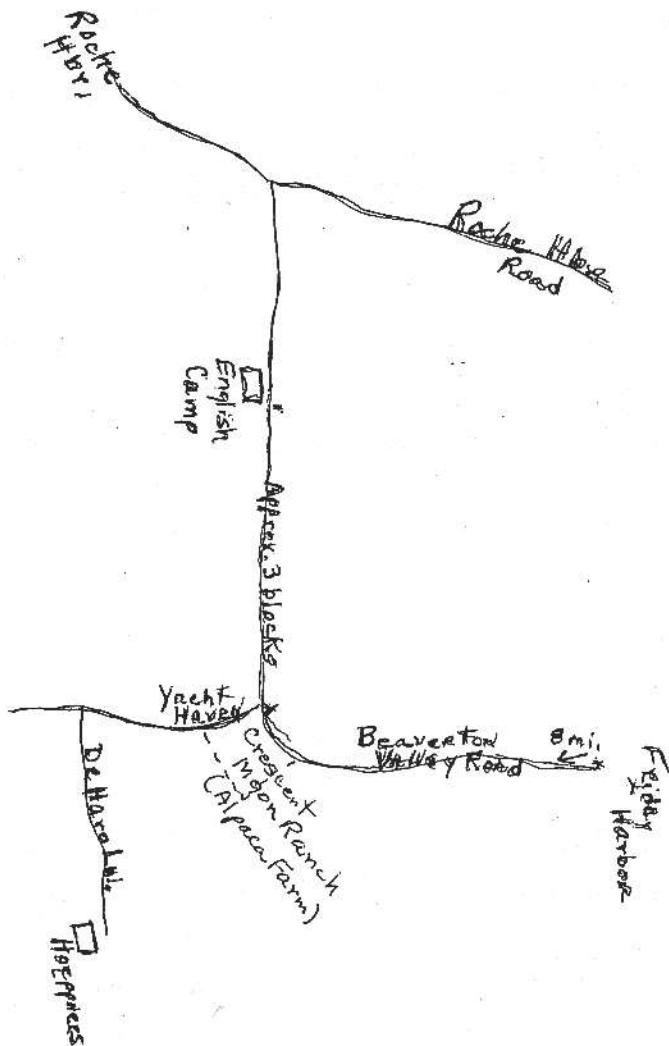

RADIO TECHNICAL

Effective 1 April 1999, the Canadian Coast Guard is dividing the current Vancouver Coast Guard Radio and Vancouver Traffic. There will be 2 MCTS centers.

Channel 12 and Vancouver Coast Guard Radio will monitor distress and working channels. The center identifiers and "Vancouver Traffic" and "Vancouver Coast Guard"

The second center will be known as "Victoria MCST." The center identifiers are "Victoria TRAFFIC" and "Victoria Coast Guard Radio" Service for Vessel Traffic Service will be on Channel 11. Victoria Coast Guard Radio's responsibility includes Canadian waters of Juan de Fuca Strait, Gulf Islands, Strait of Georgia to Merry and Ballenas Island.

Squadron members might want to listen to these channels when they are transiting these areas. Those large freighters move can move at 20 + knots and can be on top of you before you are aware of any potential problem.
